This was a virtual event with over 300 members attending from across the province (250 virtually, and 56 gathered in 5 councils). Members attended from Toronto Diocese as well as the Dioceses of Pembroke, Peterborough and Thunder Bay. Wilma Vanderzwagg, OPC 1st Vice President/Spiritual Development Chair and Maria Bertoldo, Thunder Bay Past President were also in attendance. Another way of getting members to feel a part of things is to use an icebreaker at the start of meetings. We talked about this strategy when the Welcome Program was presented last year.

St. Joseph Parish Council (Scarborough Region) used an icebreaker activity at their February meeting and members reported enjoying the activity. As they entered the hall members chose half a heart with half of a word. Their challenge was to find the member with the other half of the heart and spark a conversation to get to know them better. In her Communiqué #17, National Community Life Chairperson Faith Anderson advised that an ad hoc committee of national officers and Indigenous members has been formed to help deepen our relationships with Indigenous Catholic women: "The committee wishes to gather information from members at large so it can recommend the necessary supports and resources to ensure Indigenous members are equally valued, respected, nurtured and able to fully participate in all League activities and projects, and to encourage them to take on leadership roles."
