

CWL Annual Meeting of Members

After the instructed vote to amend the *Constitution and Bylaws* held last year, the term "annual meeting of members" (AMM) is used instead of "convention".



The meeting was held on August 13-15 in Saint John, New Brunswick. Toronto Diocesan Accredited Delegates Kate O'Quinn (President-Elect/Organization) and myself, as your president, did not attend in person as a cost-saving measure. The meeting was available virtually and we attended in that manner. Other diocesan executive members also attend virtually and I am hoping that many of you also did.



Registation to attend virtually cost \$5 to help cover the cost of mailing the annual report as well as the annual report summary. One hundred and nineteen voting and accredited delegates attended in person and 178 members attended virtually. The theme was Catholic and Living it! The opening Eucharistic celebration was held at

Holy Redeemer Church in Saint John.

The 103rd national meeting of members opened with reports presented by provincial presidents and national officers that conveyed the many works and activities members across Canada have completed over the past year. These oral reports will be available in the fall issue of *The Canadian League* magazine.

National council adopted **Resolution 2023.01 Combating Textile Waste in Canada**. The resolution urges the federal government to establish new programs and expand established subsidies aimed at reducing textile waste in Canada. The full text of the resolution may be found on the national website, cwl.ca. Diocesan Resolutions Chair, Connie Cristinziano will inform further in the fall.

National President-Elect and Chairperson of Organization Shari Guinta and the lead members of the strategic planning implementation committee gave a presentation on the progress of the working groups. The national election was held on Tuesday, August 15. The League welcomes a new slate of officers to the national executive/board, including National President Shari Guinta, National Vice President Betty Colaneri, National Secretary-Treasurer

Dorothy Johansen, National Past President Fran Lucas, National Chairperson of Faith Rolande Chernichan, National Chairperson of Service Joline Belliveau and National Chairperson of Social Justice Glenda Carson.

The closing mass was held at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, with Bishop Jensen as the celebrant. Bishop Riesbeck, Most Rev. Douglas Crosby (Hamilton) and newly appointed National Spiritual Advisor Bishop Lobsinger were concelebrants. Prior to the final blessing, the installation of the national officers and the national spiritual advisor was held.

More detailed information will be given to members at the fall regional meetings.



Organizational Renewal



The League now stands with 60,000 members. Twenty nine councils chose to leave the organization and 21 others choose not to renew their memberships of women in their councils. There is cause for celebration

however, as 17 councils returned and two new councils were formed (in Toronto!!).

There were almost 3,800 members who were either new to the League or had chosen to renew their memberships after a pause.

Kate O'Quinn, Diocesan Chair of Organization (and President-Elect) will again be offering training sessions through the CWL Wednesdays as well as the Parish Executive Training. She will have more information in her Fall newsletter article as well as online.

SEASON OF CREATION 2023

The annual event of the Season of Creation begins on September 1 (the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) and ends on October 4 (the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of ecology). Each year a theme is chosen by an ecumenical steering committee and in 2023 inspiration is taken from Amos 5:24 that proclaims, "Let Justice and Peace Flow" and the symbol is "A Mighty River."
