#### **Toronto Diocesan Policies and Procedures**

Under the direction of Past-President, Hilarion Mitchell, the Toronto Diocesan Council (TDC) is working diligently to update its *Manual of Policy and Procedure*. The current manual (2022) is available on our website. The national manual is available at <u>www.cwl.ca</u> (Resource #615).

The TDC manual is being updated to reflect the change in our executive structure which will come into effect at the elections at our convention in April. The Toronto Diocesan 103rd Annual Convention will be held on **April 29 and 30**, **2024**, at the Ajax Convention Centre. Two day registration will be \$50. Further information will be sent to councils in February.

The Ontario Provincial Convention will be held on July 7-10 in Sudbury and hosted by the Sault Ste. Marie Diocesan Council. It's a short drive to Sudbury and the host council is planning a great convention. We invite you to "BEE there". If you have not been to a provincial convention, this would be the one to attend.

#### Membership



If you are planning a membership drive, have you looked at the *Why Become a Member* page on the National website? There are six short videos - *A National Sisterhood, Empowering Women, A Deeper Faith, Social Justice, Tea, Sandwiches and Saving the World, and Fulfillment.* Some resources that you may find useful from the national website are #623 *Embracing Diversity: Tools for Councils Use #*634 *Intergenerational Activity Program* and don't forget the promotional items (#300 items) that

can help you with a great display. Be loud and proud by wearing your scarf and pin. The 2024 per capita dues payable to National are \$32 per member. Please submit your dues by **February 28th** to ensure that councils at all levels promptly receive their allocated operating funds: National \$25, Provincial \$3, and Diocesan \$4. Insurance fees are also payable at the same time.

#### **Budget Planning**

Every council should have a budget in place at the start of each fiscal year. It fosters prudent financial stewardship as it guides your activities without having to reassess monetary decisions. The Treasurer's role is to draft the budget and balance the numbers, while the entire executive is responsible to provide input on the



planned activities and required fundraisers. What do you want to do? Where will the money come from? Are you planning any milestone events?

Discussions should be held in November or December using the current budget and monthly treasurer's reports as a guide. The Treasurer presents the proposed budget at the <u>general meeting</u> in January and makes a motion to adopt it. Despite careful planning, a budget is not a precise calculation. Unforeseen incidents can occur and events don't always happen as planned. Be prepared for unexpected expenses and lower revenue, such as a sudden parish need, urgent humanitarian aid, lower attendance at the fall supper, or a less-profitable bake sale.

Councils should download the *Guidelines for Treasurers* manual posted on the National website. It includes an overview of duties, sample budget, and sample annual Report: CWL Manuals (resource #609).

Diocesan, provincial and national councils all retain one to record the deceased sisters and spiritual advisors in our diocese, province and country. They are treasured remembrances of the incredible people with whom



we have shared faith, fun and fellowship. We honor and pray for them at a special Memorial Service held at every annual convention. The deadline to report deaths for the annual Book of Life entries is January 15th of the following year. #### Teaching Divine Liturgy Submitted by Rita Jakym, Spiritual Development Chair, Durham Region CWL

On Saturday, October 28, members of the Durham Region CWL joined with their UCWL Sisters at St. George the Great Martyr Ukrainian Catholic Church in Oshawa to celebrate a teaching Divine Liturgy. Reverend Father Dmytro Hancharyk and Reverend Father Bohdan Bilinsky celebrated the Divine Liturgy (Mass) with commentary before and during this special service by Reader Mr. Oleh Bych. The most striking visual difference is the iconostasis which represents one of the most important architectural features of Eastern Rite churches. The iconostasis is an unbroken screen composed of icons separating the sanctuary (symbol of Heaven) from the central nave (symbol of Earth) where the congregation gathers. We all learned about the similarities and difference in the two Rites of the Catholic Church. Oleh shared Pope John Paul II's analogy of the left lung representing the Latin Rite and the right lung representing the Eastern Rite. A humanitarian collection for "Food Boxes for Ukraine" through the papal agency Catholic Near East Welfare Association was received with donations of \$1035.00. Following the Divine Liturgy, all the ladies enjoyed a beautiful buffet lunch that included Ukrainan pyrohy, cabbage rolls and shish kabobs in the church hall. The delicious meal was prepared and served by members of St. George's UCWL Branch #1. This was a wonderful enriching spiritual experience, filled with faith, fun and fellowship.
