National Family and Life Week 2024

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) warmly invites the Catholic faithful to celebrate **National Family and Life Week 2024 (NFLW)**, which will take place from **13 – 19 May 2024**.

This year's theme, "Love hopes all things," is inspired by the words of Saint Paul, the Apostle: **"[Love] bears all things,**



believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (1 Corinthians 13:7). This theme, linked to *Amoris Laetitia*, a discourse on love by Pope Francis, guides us towards hope, a theological virtue that renews our relationship with God and others.

The CCCB Standing Committee for Family and Life and its corresponding Office have developed a pastoral toolkit specifically designed for the "domestic church" in our national context. Each day of National Family and Life Week 2024 is built around specific themes, proposing prayers and activities adapted to different ages, cultures and circumstances.

Concluding on the Solemnity of Pentecost, National Family and Life Week 2024 offers a special opportunity to ask the Holy Spirit to accompany us in this celebration of life and the family. To access the English toolkit just click on this link"

From St. Helen Parish




St. Helen's is one of our smaller parishes but keeps the community involved in their activities. An update from Council President Susana Pimentel:



In Memoriam: Rev. James Martin Reposkey, C.P.P.S.



Rev. James Martin Reposkey C.P.P.S. , who devoted an astounding 50 years to his service as Missionary of the Most Precious Blood, Atlantic Province, passed away peacefully, on April 9, 2024

Following his ordination on May 4, 1974, Fr. Jim served as an Associate Pastor at St. Roch's Church, Toronto, and later became its Pastor. In 1992, he was assigned to St. Alphonsus Church, Toronto, where he served as Pastor. His final assignment as Pastor in 2016, was at St. Charles Borromeo Church, Toronto.

Fr. Jim was known for his compassionate heart and inability to refuse anyone in need. He served as a spiritual advisor for the Catholic Women's League in the Central Toronto Region for many years, held memberships in the Knights of the Holy Sepulcher and the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, Council 1388. He took immense pride in wearing the religious habit and missionary cross.

The CWL was well represented at his funeral by the Diocesan Council as well as by many members of the Toronto Region. Fr. Reposkey will be greatly missed by the CWL.

"May the choir of angels, Come to greet you. May they speed you to

paradise. May the Lord enfold you In His mercy. May you find eternal life.”
